

Barry's introduction to the FSSP, he is travelling this weekend to apostolates in the region to get to know them.

SEXAGESIMA SUNDAY—The Church offers to our consideration, during this week of Sexagesima, the history of Noah and the deluge. Man has not profited by the warnings already given him. God is obliged to punish him once more, and by a terrible chastisement. There is found out of the whole human race one just man; God makes a covenant with him, and with us through him. But, before He draws up this new alliance, He would show that He is the sovereign Master, and that man, and the earth whereon he lives, subsist solely by His power and permission.

As the ground-work of this week's instructions, we give a short passage from the Book of Genesis: it is read in the Office of this Sunday's Matins.

"And God seeing that the wickedness of men was great on the earth, and that all the thought of their heart was bent upon evil at all times, it repented him that he had made man on the earth. And being touched inwardly with sorrow of heart, he said: I will destroy man, whom I have created, from the face of the earth, from man even to beasts, from the creeping thing even to the fowls of the air. For it repenteth me that I have made them. But Noah found grace before the Lord. These are the generations of Noah: Noah was a just and perfect man in his generations: he walked with God. And he begot three sons: Sem, Cham, and Japheth. And the earth was corrupted before God, and was filled with iniquity. And when God had seen that the earth was corrupted (for all flesh had corrupted its way upon the earth), he said to Noah: The end of all flesh is come before me: the earth is filled with iniquity through them, and I will destroy them with the earth."

Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: O God Of Loveliness, 930 Recessional hymn: Faith Of Our Fathers, 928

Kyriale: Mass XI, 740; Credo IV, 780

Marian Antiphon: *Ave Regina Cælorum*, Solemn Chant Communion Antiphon: *Introibo Ad*, Heinrich Isaac

The communion antiphon set by **Heinrich Isaac** is taken from Psalm 42(43):4, "And I will go in to the altar of God: to God who giveth joy to my youth." In this short antiphon he ornaments the Gregorian melody and uses it as the musical foundation in the Soprano and Tenor voices. The schola sings the Gregorian antiphon first and between each iteration of the antiphon, verses from Psalm 42(43) are sung.

Heinrich Isaac (c.1450–1517) was a Renaissance composer from the South Netherlandish region. His output was rivaled only by Orlandus Lassus in number and variety of composition. Most notable of his collections is Choralis Constantinus which contains nearly 400 Gregorian chant based motets of propers for the Mass.
