BROWN SCAPULAR ENROLLMENT—July 16 is the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. There will be a Solemn High Mass at 6:30pm that evening, after which all who would like to be enrolled in the Brown Scapular may do so at the communion rail. This sacramental traces its origin to 1251, when Our Lady appeared to St. Simon Stock in Cambridge, England on July 26 after he prayed for help for his Order. She appeared to him with the scapular and said, "Take, beloved son this scapular of thy order as a badge of my confraternity and for thee and all Carmelites a special sign of grace; whoever dies in this garment, will not suffer everlasting fire. It is the sign of salvation, a safeguard in dangers, a pledge of peace and of the covenant." The Sabbatine Privilege, quoted in a decree of the Holy Office in 1633, is a promise of Our Lady's intercession for those in Purgatory who, in earthly life wore the Scapular in good faith always (it can be taken off to bathe), were chaste according to their state in life, daily recited the Divine Office or, with the permission of one's Confessor, the Litle Office of Our Lady or the Rosary; and departed earthly life in charity.

LAST CHANCE: REGISTER FOR BOOT CAMP—Acolyte Boot Camp, which runs from Monday, July 15 to Friday, July 19, is open to all boys who have received their First Holy Communion. Along with our priests and adult volunteers, we have three FSSP seminarians to train the boys to pray and to serve Low Mass, High Mass, Vespers, and Benediction. This will be a great opportunity for your boys to learn new serving roles and we will have a special class dedicated to teaching the new boys their Latin prayers. Every evening we will have Vespers with ceremony, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction, and Sung Mass or Solemn High Mass. There is no cost to participate in Acolyte Boot Camp. FSSP GENERAL CHAPTER—The Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter is holding its general chapter from July 3 to 18 in Denton, Nebraska. For a religious order, the general chapter is the highest governing body with the task of electing the superior general and his leadership team. For the FSSP, the general chapter meets for a few weeks every six years to choose the team to work out of FSSP headquarters in Switzerland, as well as the task of making policies for the FSSP. This year's general chapter is made up of 36 FSSP priests, 19 of which were elected by their confreres, and the rest attending due to their positions. Please pray that the chapter will be lead by the Holy Ghost to choose wisely the best team to lead the FSSP for the next six years.

FR. SMITH ON FSSP BUSINESS FOR JULY—Fr. Smith is in Nebraska attending the FSSP general chapter in Denton, Nebraska, as an elected member and is scheduled to return on July 19. In addition, Father will go as he has in past years to represent the FSSP to the Napa Institute's summer conference at the end of July.

PRO POPULO MASS—According to very old tradition, and the law of the Church, a pastor is obliged to offer Mass every Sunday and Holy Day for his parishioners. Of course, this is something that a pastor would or should normally do even when not obliged, but when a pastor is travelling, as Fr. Smith is currently, you will not see the *pro populo* (which means, *for the people*) intention listed in the bulletin, but you can be assured that he is still praying for you, and offers the *pro populo* each Sunday and holy day when he is travelling. For your reference, canon 534 of the Code of Canon Law, refers to this obligation as follows: "After a pastor has taken possession of his parish, he is obliged to apply a Mass for the people entrusted to him on each Sunday and holy day of obligation in his diocese."

Motet at communion: Caro mea, Andrea Gabrieli (c. 1532–1585)

Caro Mea by Andrea Gabrieli (c. 1532–1585) is a setting of John 6:56–57 composed for the feast of Corpus Christi: "My flesh is meat indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him." Gabrieli's motet is an excellent example of a Renaissance motet containing short a motive that is repeated by all voices in their respective ranges, imitative lines throughout and reaching the climax about two thirds through the work and ending with a final major chord, though the work was in minor throughout.

Andrea Gabrieli (c. 1532–1585) was an Italian composer and organist of the late Renaissance. The uncle of the somewhat more famous Giovanni Gabrieli and contemporary of Orlandus Lassus. From 1566 until his death he held the post as organist at St. Mark's in Venice, which was one of the most prominent music positions in Italy. His works include over a hundred motets and madrigals, as well as a smaller number of instrumental works.
