PRO POPULO MASS—According to very old tradition, and the law of the Church, a pastor is obliged to offer Mass every Sunday and Holy Day for his parishioners. Of course, this is something that a pastor would or should normally do even when not obliged, but when a pastor is travelling, as Fr. Smith will be next weekend, you will not see the *pro populo* (which means, *for the people*) intention listed in the bulletin, but you can be assured that he is still praying for you, and offers the *pro populo* each Sunday and holy day when he is travelling. For your reference, canon 534 of the Code of Canon Law, refers to this obligation as follows: "After a pastor has taken possession of his parish, he is obliged to apply a Mass for the people entrusted to him on each Sunday and holy day of obligation in his diocese."

ST. LAWRENCE BABY BOTTLE FUNDRAISER—Thanks to the generosity of our parishioners, the St. Lawrence Prolife Group was able to raise \$1,092 for the York Pregnancy Center. This fundraising helps provided much need resources, social support and medical services for mothers and children at risk for abortion. ANNOUNCING: PARISH LIBRARY ONLINE—Thanks to the generous donations and hard work of many parishioners, the parish library makes it's first big step by being online. From the parish librarian: "You can explore our progress and experiment with searching techniques at our library website is https:// stlawrencechurchlibrary.goAlexandria.com. Many of the subject headings will be changed to suit our needs. We have almost finished the first sweep of the current stock and almost half the books have been entered into the new cloud system. Subjects are on the library notice board. We have reached the Liturgy section online. The first lending section is Adult Education. This section was personally compiled by one of our librarians and is for Inquirers as well as those who want to know the faith better and want something to read that isn't too difficult. FSSP GENERAL CHAPTER CONCLUSION—The FSSP

General Chapter, which meets every six years for two or three weeks and is the highest authority within the FSSP, concluded last week, at which it completed important work for the ongoing life of the Fraternity. Most importantly, it elected a new superior general, Fr. John Berg, FSSP, who previously served in this role. In addition, the chapter elected the members of the General Council, which cooperates with Fr. Berg in the governance of the Fraternity.

The FSSP issued the following statement about the superior general: "The general chapter of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter (FSSP), which takes place from July 3 to July 18, 2024 at the International Seminary of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Denton, Nebraska, in plenary session elected Fr. John Berg as superior general for six years. This election, at which the 32 capitulants were present, took place on Tuesday, July 9. In succeeding Fr. Andrzej Komorowski, Fr. John Berg intends to continue the work undertaken these last six years in the service of the Fraternity....

"An American priest born in 1970, Fr. John Berg studied philosophy at Thomas Aquinas College (California, USA) and theology at the International Seminary of St. Peter in Wigratzbad (Bavaria, Germany). Fr. Berg holds a licentiate from the Pontifical University of the Holy Cross in Rome. Ordained a priest in 1997, Fr. Berg was a professor at the International Seminary of Our Lady of Guadalupe (Nebraska, USA). He served as superior general of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter from 2006 to 2018. For the past six years he returned to parochial work with the Faithful as the pastor of the Fraternity parishes in Providence, Rhode Island; and Omaha, Nebraska."

FR. SMITH ON FSSP BUSINESS FOR JULY—Fr. Smith will go as he has in past years to represent the FSSP to the Napa Institute's summer conference at the end of July.

Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: Lift Up Your Heads, Ye Mighty Gates, 931

Communion Antiphon: Qui Manducat, Heinrich Isaac (c.1450-

The communion antiphon sung this Sunday is another a setting by **Heinrich Isaac**: He who eats My Flesh, and drinks My Blood, abides in Me, and I in him, says the Lord. In this composition the Tenor voice retains the Gregorian melody with only slight ornamentation throughout. Unlike the setting heard last week, all the voices enter immediately following the incipit and maintain homophony (all voices moving as one voice) for the text, "and drinks My Blood." Then each voice enters at different times weaving in and out, cross, and occasionally meet on the same tone and move apart—this movement between voices portrays "abide in Me and I in him" musically.

Heinrich Isaac (c.1450–1517) was a Renaissance composer from the South Netherlandish region. His output was rivaled only by Orlandus Lassus in number and variety of composition. Most notable of his collections is *Choralis Constantinus* which contains nearly 400 Gregorian chant based motets of propers for the Mass.
