ASSUMPTION BLESSSING OF HERBS- According to tradition, after Our Lady's Assumption into heaven, flowers were found growing out of the sarcophagus in which Mary had been laid, and a sweet odor rose out of the tomb, confirming the Apostles' faith in Our Lady's Assumption. In honor of this tradition, the Church instituted the custom of blessing wild herbs and flowers on the feast of the Assumption. The blessing originated in Germany, and is first attested in the 10th century; one version of it or another is found in a great many of the liturgical books which contain blessings of this sort. If you would like to have your herbs blessed, there will be a table near the front of the church, and one of the priests will bless the herbs after each of the Masses.

AUG 31: BLESSING OF WATER AND CANDLES—There will be a special blessing for water and candles to be used by expectant mothers during birth in honor of St. Raymond Nonnatus, one of the founders of the Order of Our Lady of Ransom in the mid-1200s. St. Raymond, due to the circumstances of his birth, is known as the Patron saint of expectant mothers and midwives. This water can be consumed throughout one's pregnancy and the candles lit during birth to invoke the saint's patronge and intercession for safe delivery.

Notes on Today's Music

For the occasion of the solemnity of our patron's feast, the choir will sing the *Missa Beatus Laurentius* by **Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina** (c. 1525–1594), which is a polyphonic setting of the ordinary text of the Mass. *Beatus Laurentius* is the fifth antiphon from Vespers for the feast. Both the Mass and motet are composed using a *cantus firmus*, where one voice is singing the original Gregorian melody in long notes while the musical ideas are developed in the other four voices. Palestrina used the themes created in the motet and altered them to fit the various texts for the Ordinary of the Mass, giving the composition the designation of a "Parody Mass." The five voice choir splits into six for the final movement where two tenor voices singing in canon—meaning the same tune but a few measures apart—using the Gregorian melody to the text of Agnus Dei.

Deus Tuorum Militum is the hymn from Vespers which is sung for feasts of one martyr. Victoria composed the even verses of this hymn and alternated with one of the plainchant melodies.

G.P. Palestrina (c. 1525–1594) is highly regarded for his contributions of Sacred Polyphony and development of counterpoint in the late 16th Century. In the post-Tridentine period he earned the reputation of the ideal Catholic composer for his success in reconciling the functional and aesthetic aims of Catholic church music. Palestrina wrote over 105 Masses and 250 sacred motets in addition to many other works.

FROM THE PARISH LIBRARIAN—The library website is http://stlawrencechurchlibrary.goAlexandria.com. I hope you saved or book marked it by now! We have also changed the icons on the front page to suit St Lawrence. We will improve on them as time goes on. Saint Augustine is the next section. There is a whole series by him in the reference section and, as with Saint Thomas Aquinas, this section contains volumes written about him and commenting on his works. Then we have Autobiography and Biography in the same category. There is some duplication with the Saints section here but any book will be easy to find, thanks to the software. Then we have Catholic Social Teaching. This is wide ranging section containing topics like Abortion, Homeschooling, Human Vitae and many others. Christ's Passion is next and is followed by a section on the Church Fathers. It includes the Doctors of the Church. For example, John Fink's two volume series on the Doctors recommended by the FSSP.

SPANISH ADULT CATECHISM CLASS—Beginning in September, at the same time as the regular Adult Catechism class after the Sunday High Mass, St. Lawrence will begin offering a Spanish-language catechism class in room 301 of the parish center. This class will use as a text the Catechism of Pope St. Pius X, which is directed to the lay faithful and in question and answer format similar to the Balltimore catechism. This text was used by Monsignor John Hagan in his *Compendium of Catechetical Instruction*.
