DISCIPLE MAKER INDEX LIVE TODAY—All of us have the mission to know, love, and serve Christ in our parish community. Together we must embrace Christ's vision for missionary discipleship so our parish can thrive and be a place for others to grow together in faith. Bp. Senior has launched a process to help all parishes with this, and the first step is to assess our strengths and opportunities through the Disciple Maker Index (DMI). The DMI is an important survey tool that invites you to reflect on your experience at St. Lawrence. The Disciple Maker Index is designed to:

- Invite parishioners to reflect on their experience.
- Enable parish leadership to make data-driven decisions.
- Help parishioners grow in their faith.

It will be active until November 24, will ask you to reflect on your own spiritual growth and enable you to provide your perspective on our parish's efforts to help you grow with Christ. Every member of the household 18 and over should complete this survey. All responses will be confidential, and the parish will only receive information about the community as a whole. Paper surveys will also be available for those who do not have the ability to complete the survey online.

TODAY: WORLD MISSIONS SUNDAY—In 1926 Pope Pius XI instituted Mission Sunday for the whole Church with the first worldwide Mission Sunday collection taking place in October 1927. The Mission Sunday collection is always taken on the next to last Sunday during the month of October. That day is celebrated in all the local Churches as the feast of catholicity and universal solidarity so Christians the world over will recognize their common responsibility with regard to the evangelization of the world.

SECOND COLLECTION—Although today is World Mission Sunday, our collection for missions will be next week. Today we have a second collection for the Building Fund.

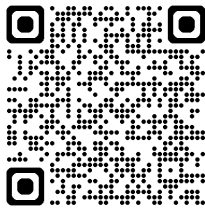

Processional hymn: *My God, Accept My Heart This Day*, 942

Offertory antiphon: *Recordare mei*, Jeffery Quick
 Hymn at the communion: *Adoremus in Aeternum*, Gregorio Allegri (c.1582–1652)

This Sunday the Offertory antiphon is a choral setting by living composer **Jeffery Quick**. The translation of the text is: *Remember me, O Lord, you who dominate all authority; put the right words on my lips, so that my speech may be convincing in the presence of the King*. Mr. Quick's short motet makes use of a five note phrase that is repeated in each voice throughout the composition.

Jeffery Quick (b. 1956) is a composer, music editor, and director based in Ohio. He received a BM in music history from the University of Michigan, and a MM in composition from Cleveland State University. He was assistant music librarian at Case Western Reserve University for 22 years, and presently directs the schola cantorum of St. Mary Church in Akron OH.
