Banns of Marriage



LETTER FROM THE BISHOP—Bishop Senior has written a letter to mark the start of Advent and the beginning of the 2025 Jubilee Year. Please pick up a copy, which is available near the bulletins to learn more.

DEC. 2: FUNERAL FOR JOHN ROZMAN— We will be having a Funeral Mass for the soul of our recently deceased parishioner, John Rozman, tomorrow at 11am. The Funeral Mass will be preceded by the Divine Office for the Dead beginning at 10am. Burial will be at Indiantown Gap National Cemetary in Annville. We hope that you can join us for this important spiritual work of mercy.

DEC. 7: RORATE MASS—In honor of Our Lady, we will celebrate a Rorate Mass this Saturday, Dec.7, at 6:30am. The Rorate Mass is held in darkness illuminated by candlelight before the sun rises and symbolizes the longing for the Light of the world, who is given to us through Our Lady. The church eventually gets brighter as the sun rises. After the conclusion of the Mass, the priest intones an antiphon three times, with each invocation at a higher tone just as he does for the Easter Vigil alleluia. The antiphon says: "Behold, the Lord comes and all his saints with him and on that day there will be a great light, alleluia."

DEC. 8: MUSICIANS NEEDED FOR TOUR—The

Harrisburg Historic Association has requested that our church and parish center be on the candlelight house tour that the group organizes every year. Indeed, this year will be the first time that St. Lawrence has been on the tour since 1979. The tour will be from 1pm to 6pm on Sunday, Dec. 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. In order to make our parish more delightful for tour visitors, we would be grateful if musicians in the parish would volunteer to play music at different times of the afternoon during the tour. DEC. 9: DISPENSATION FOR HOLY DAY—Since the Feast of the Immaculate Conception is moved to Monday when it falls on a Sunday in most parishes, and since it is a Holy Day of obligation, the obligation is also moved to Monday according to a new interpretation of the law by the Holy See. Due to the late notice of this interpretation, however, Bp. Senior has granted a dispensation from this obligation to assist at Holy Mass this year. In the 1962 rubrics, however, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception is not moved, which we will celebrate here at St. Lawrence next Sunday, on Dec. 8.



Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: Savior of the Nations, Come, 798 Recessional hymn: Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus, 801 Credo V, 784; Kyriale XVII, 762

Offertory motet: Ad Te Levavi, Reverend Franz Xaver Witt (1834 - 1888)

Communion motet: Veni Redemptor Gentium, Cristóbal de Morales

The hymn Veni, redemptor gentium was composed by St. Ambrose of Milan and two stanzas were set to music by Cristóbal de Morales. Only partial manuscripts remain for Morales's setting and the score sung today was reconstructed by the chair of Boston College's Music Department, Dr. Michael Noone. Some religious orders use the hymn during Christmastide while many areas in Germany traditionally sing it during Advent. The English-poetic translation of this hymn is this Sunday's processional hymn, Savior of the Nations, Come.

Cristóbal de Morales (c.1500-1553) was an organist and composer regarded as the first Spanish composer of international renown. He sang and composed for the Papal choir in Rome for which he wrote many Mass settings. His compositions consist almost entirely of sacred vocal motets.
