HOLIDAY PARISH OFFICE HOURS—Please note that the Parish Office will be closed Tuesday, Dec. 24 through Thursday, Dec. 26, and from noon, Tuesday, Dec. 31 through Wednesday, Jan. 1.

EMBER DAYS—This week the Church observes the Fast of Quatuor Tempora, or the Ember days, on Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. Though this fast is no longer obligatory by church law, it is still recommended. These days are fixed for each of the four seasons of the Ecclesiastical Year, a practice which the Church took from the Synagogue (see Zech. 8:19) likely in Apostolic times. These days are intended to consecrate the seasons of the year to the Lord by way of penance. "The fruits of the year, which is drawing to a close, are now all gathered in, and we most meetly offer our abstinence to God as a sacrifice of thanksgiving. And what can be more useful than fasting, that exercise by which we draw nigh to God, make a stand against the devil, and overcome the softer enticements of sin? ... [M]ay every one of us that shall offer to the God of all goodness this Advent sacrifice of fasting and alms be by Him fitted to receive an eternal reward in His heavenly kingdom! We fast on Wednesday and Friday; and there is likewise a Vigil on Saturday at the Church of St. Peter, that by his good prayers we may the more effectually obtain what we ask for" (Sermon of Pope St. Leo the Great). Dom Guéranger reminds us that "although the interior preparation is what is absolutely essential for our profiting by the Coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, yet this preparation could scarcely be real, unless it manifested itself by the exterior practices of religion and penance" (The Liturgical Year, vol. 1, from which the above is drawn).

Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: Hark! A Herald Voice is Calling, 795

Dufay (c. 1397-1474)

In 1935 Karl Ott published the *Offertoriale*, which is a book that provides verses for the offertory chants of Sundays and Feasts throughout the year which are not otherwise provided in schola chant scores. This Sunday, the offertory antiphon will be chanted and the verse is a contemporary composition by **Nicholas**Lemme set for three part men's voices. Lemme's setting is anchored on two notes which are repeated often in the verse and droned as the original chant melody returns at the end. The text is from Psalm 84:8, "Show us Lord, your mercy and grant us Thy salvation."

Nicholas Lemme (b. 1978) is a composer, singer, and professor of music based in Lincoln, Neb. Mr. Lemme teaches sacred polyphony, and voice at Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary, FSSP, Denton, Neb. and holds the position of Choir Master at St. Francis of Assisi Oratory, Lincoln, Neb.
