Tom, a long-time parishioner of St. Lawrence, died early Thursday, Jan. 9. His funeral will be Thursday, Jan. 16, with ceremonies at the church beginning at 9am with the Divine Office of the Dead, then the high funeral Mass at 10:30am.

Please remember that to help bury the dead is a corporal work of mercy. As it says in the Baltimore Catechism:

Our Lord taught explicitly that one can earn the eternal reward of heaven by performing the corporal works of mercy and that those who deliberately refuse to perform such works will be barred from heaven....That Almighty God is pleased to reward those who bury the dead is distinctly taught in the book of Tobias. To visit a house of mourning or to attend a funeral is a mark of respect to the dead and a consolation to the relatives of the deceased person.

(b. 1967)

O Admirabile Commercium, is a motet by Fabio Constantini and setting of the first Antiphon from Vespers on the Octave of Christmas. The translation is: *O admirable exchange: the creator* of human-kind, taking on a living body was worthy to be born of a virgin, and, coming forth as a human without seed, has given us his deity in abundance.

Fabio Constantini (c. 1575–1644) was an Italian music editor and composer. He sang under Palestrina at St Peter's, Rome (until 1610), and held posts as maestro di cappella, notably at Orvieto Cathedral (1610-14, 1618-22), Santa Casa, Loreto, Ancona and Ferrara Cathedral.
