Please place your candles on the floor in front of the door that goes to the courtyard on the Epistle side of the Church.

FEB. 3: BLESSING OF THE THROATS— On the Feast of St. Blaise, come to the church to receive the traditional blessing of throats through the intercession of St. Blaise, to be healed of any mid-winter throat ailments. The priests will give the blessing after Mass.

BLESSING OF BREAD, FRUIT, WINE, & WATER—In addition to receiving the blessing yourself on Feb. 3, The Feast of St. Blaise, you may bring bread, fruits, wine, and water to be blessed so that, as the blessing says, "May they who taste thereof be fully healed of all affliction of the throat, as well as every infirmity of soul or body, through the prayers and merits of the same Blaise, Pontiff and Martyr." The blessing on the Feast of St. Blaise, though, asks the people to bring items to be blessed. It says: "We humbly beseech thy boundless mercy, and beg that these fruits, bread, wine, and water, which thy devoted people bring today, be blessed and sanctified by thy goodness." You are most welcome (encouraged!) to bring things on that day for the blessing. Bring them before Mass and set them in front of Our Lady's altar to be blessed immediately after Mass. Note: please do not bring items for this blessing before Feb.3

Notes on Today's Music


Processional hymn: O Lord, I Am Not Worthy, 902 Recessional hymn: As With Gladness Men of Old, 819

Credo V, 784, Kyriale VIII, 727

Offertory Antiphon: *Dextera Domini*, Orlandus Lassus Communion Antiphon: *Miribantur Omnes*, A. Jones

This Sunday's propers are one of two sets that repeat each Sunday until the liturgical season changes. Both the Offertory and Communion antiphons will be sung as choral settings. The original chant for *Dextera Domini* is in mode 2 and **Orlandus Lassus** uses the original mode for his composition while composing entirely original music for the antiphon. The setting of *Mirabantur Omnes* is a new composition by a member of the choir and is a world premiere.

Orlandus Lassus (c.1532–1594) is known for the mature polyphonic style in the Franco-Flemish school. He wrote over 2,000 works in Latin, French, Italian, and German both sacred and secular. Lassus along with Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina and Tomás Luis de Victoria are the most influential composers of the late Renaissance.


