**SECOND COLLECTION**—This week our second collection is for the Building Fund.

**FR. CORTES ON VACATION**—Fr. Cortes is on vacation until Mar. 1.

**FR. BARRY APPROVED FOR FSSP**—Having successfully completed his year of candidacy with the FSSP here at St. Lawrence, the FSSP recently approved Fr. Barry's request to be made a temporary member of the FSSP, which is the next step in the process of becoming a permanent member. As of press time, Fr. Barry was scheduled to be incorporated into the FSSP Saturday night before Vespers. Please congratulate Fr. Barry on this important milestone.

LENTEN MEDITATIONS WITH BUXTEHUDE—On Sat., Apr. 5, St. Lawrence Church will host the Chamber Singers of Messiah University with orchestra for a Lenten meditation. Buxtehude's *Membra Jesu Nostri* comprises of seven cantatas, each of which addresses a part of Jesus' crucified body: feet, knees, hands, side, breast, heart, and face. In each cantata, its main text is drawn from Biblical passages and the medieval hymn Salve mundi salutare, formerly ascribed to St. Bernard of Clairvaux but now thought to be by Cistercian monk Arnulf of Leuven. At the beginning of each cantata a meditation will be offered by a member of the clergy, including Bishop Timothy Senior. Reserve your tickets here: https://bit.ly/stlawrence-buxtehude.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR FASTING DURING LENT**

Laws of Days of Complete Abstinence—1962: Applies at age 7; Complete abstinence: all Fridays of the year, Ash Wednesday, Holy Saturday, and the Vigil of Christmas

**Current Practice:** Applies at age 14—Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent, and obliges abstention from flesh meat

Laws of Days of Partial Abstinence—1962: Partial abstinence: all the days of Lent, the Ember days of Wednesday & Saturday, and the Vigils of Pentecost & the Assumption (meat and soup, or gravy made from meat permitted once per day at the principal meal)

Current Practice: Not applicable

Dispensation from Laws of Days of Abstinence—1962: Abstinence from meat dispensed on Holy Days of Obligation

**Current Practice:** Dispensed on Solemnities

**Ages for Laws of Fast—1962:** Applies for ages 21 to 59, inclusive Days of Lent from Ash Wednesday inclusive of Ember Days, and Vigils of Christmas, Pentecost, and the Assumption

**Current Practice:** Age 18 to 59—Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, but also on specified days of penance

Laws of Fast (defined)—1962: One full meal permitted, & two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal

**Current Practice:** Same

**LENTEN FISH DINNERS**—The Knights of Columbus will be sponsoring Fish Fry events in the church social hall each Friday evening during Lent, with an expanded menu including child portions and non-fried options. More details will follow.

MAR. 8: PARISH FAITH BEE—Attention 7th and 8th graders (usually younger than age 15): whether you are in CCD, the Friday Program, at a private, parochial, or home school, you are invited to participate in the St. Lawrence Parish Catholic Faith Bee. The initial entry phase will be a written test on Sat., Mar. 8, at 2:30pm in the Parish Center. The top ten scorers will move on to the oral competition on Sat., Mar. 29, at 2:30pm in the Parish Center. The winner of the St. Lawrence Catholic Faith Bee will have the honor of representing our parish at the Diocesan Catholic Faith Bee that will be held on Wed., Apr. 9, at 1:30pm in the Diocesan Center in Harrisburg. **ATTENTION YOUNG LADIES AGES 14-17**—The Mater Dei Praesidium of the Legion of Mary hopes to form a junior praesidium here at St. Lawrence and would like to invite you to prayerfully consider joining! Sixteen- and seventeen-year-olds can be officers.

Being a member of a Junior Legion of Mary is a wonderful way to form and develop one's love and devotion to our Blessed Mother and to serve her and her Son Jesus by serving the Church. The meetings take place weekly for an hour and are fashioned exactly like the adult meetings. They are led by two adult members of the Legion of Mary (Janeann Kakalecz and Alice Mansell), and two junior members who would also be officers. The Legion follows the method of St. Louis Marie de Montfort's True Devotion to Mary, as established by its founder Frank Duff in Ireland on September 7, 1921, and which has spread throughout the entire world. The apostolic work of the junior praesidium is varied and carried out in a variety of settings—some at the parish, others outside under the adult supervision of members of the Legion of Mary, and some in your home within your family. All of the work is of important value to the universal Church and to your parish and takes an additional commitment of one to one and a half hours per week.

### **Notes on Today's Music**

Processional hymn: O God Of Loveliness, 930

Recessional hymn: O Thou the Martyrs' Glorious King, 872

Kyriale: Mass XI, 740; Credo V, 784

Marian Antiphon: Ave Regina Cælorum, Solemn Chant Communion Antiphon: Introibo Ad, Heinrich Isaac

The communion antiphon is another set by **Heinrich Isaac** from his *Choralis Constantinus*. The antiphon's text is taken from Psalm 42(43):4, "*And I will go in to the altar of God: to God who giveth joy to my youth.*" In this short antiphon he ornaments the Gregorian melody and uses it as the musical foundation in the Soprano and Tenor voices. The *schola* sings the Gregorian antiphon first and between each iteration of the antiphon, verses from Psalm 42(43) are sung.

**Heinrich Isaac (c.1450–1517)** was a Renaissance composer from the South Netherlandish region. His output was rivaled only by Orlandus Lassus in number and variety of composition. Most notable of his collections is *Choralis Constantinus* which contains nearly 400 Gregorian chant based motets of propers for the Mass.

STAY HOME WHEN SICK—Please note that it is an act of charity not to assist at Mass when you have a communicable illness, under the advice of a medical professional. Indeed, Baltimore Catechism III (Seton Press) instructs us that the Sunday obligation is dispensed for "those who must care for the sick...[and] those whose illness does not permit them to go outdoors," which includes those who might make others ill. If you have doubts about your condition, the following advice from Christopher Washington, MD, one of our parishiohers is helpful: "Seemingly minor illnesses can have quite serious consequences for infants, the elderly and the infirm. Prior to returning to regular activities, including Mass, symptoms should at a minimum be improving and any illnesses involving fevers should have resolution of fevers for at least 24 hours."
