MAR. 15: CONFIRMATION REHEARSAL—The Confirmation rehearsal (for confirmandi and sponsors) will be held on Saturday, Mar. 15. at 5:30pm in the church. On the day of Confirmation, Sunday, Mar. 16, at 9:15am the confirmandi will assemble in the conference room on the 2nd floor of the Parish Center for their meeting with Bishop Gainer. The sponsors will meet on the 3rd floor in the Aula Magna at 9:30am for a roll call, seating assignments, and final rehearsal.

MAR. 17: FEAST OF ST. PATRICK—Every year on March 17 the Church celebrates St. Partick, the bishop who helped bring the faith to Ireland. This feast is celebrated with added solemnity in our diocese since he is our patron saint. The faithul are invited to assist the High Mass on Monday at 6:30pm on this first class feast day.

MAR. 19: TRADITIONAL ST. JOSEPH TABLE—On Wednesday, Mar. 19, after the 6:30pm High Mass, we will have our annual St. Joseph's Bread Table. The tradition of the St. Joseph Table *la tavola di San Giuseppe* has its origin in Sicily. Legends from the Middle Ages attributed the end of a devastating drought to a prayer devotion that the Sicilian people made to St. Joseph. Please bring your bread to the front door of our Parish Center before Mass and someone will assist you. After Mass, all are invited to come and celebrate Good St. Joseph's patronage and intercession on the 3rd Floor in the Aula Magna room.

APR. 5: LENTEN MEDITATIONS—On Saturday, Apr. 5, St. Lawrence Church will host the Chamber Singers of Messiah University with orchestra for a Lenten meditation. Buxtehude's *Membra Jesu Nostri* comprises of seven cantatas, each of which addresses a part of Jesus' crucified body: feet, knees, hands, side, breast, heart, and face. In each cantata, its main text is drawn from Biblical passages and the medieval hymn Salve mundi salutare, formerly ascribed to St. Bernard of Clairvaux but now thought to be by Cistercian monk Arnulf of Leuven. MAR. 15: DEADLINE FOR REGINA CAELI—Homeschooling families are invited to apply to the NEW Harrisburg-area Regina Caeli Academy, an accredited Catholic homeschool hybrid program in classical tradition. GUIDELINES FOR FASTING DURING LENT

Laws of Days of Complete Abstinence—1962: Applies at age 7; Complete abstinence: all Fridays of the year, Ash Wednesday, Holy Saturday, and the Vigil of Christmas

Current Practice: Applies at age 14—Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent, and obliges abstention from flesh meat

Laws of Days of Partial Abstinence—1962: Partial abstinence: all the days of Lent, the Ember days of Wednesday & Saturday, and the Vigils of Pentecost & the Assumption (meat and soup, or gravy made from meat permitted once per day at the principal meal)

Current Practice: Not applicable

Dispensation from Laws of Days of Abstinence—1962: Abstinence from meat dispensed on Holy Days of Obligation

Current Practice: Dispensed on Solemnities

Ages for Laws of Fast—1962: Applies for ages 21 to 59, inclusive Days of Lent from Ash Wednesday inclusive of Ember Days, and Vigils of Christmas, Pentecost, and the Assumption

Current Practice: Age 18 to 59—Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, but also on specified days of penance

Laws of Fast (defined)—1962: One full meal permitted, & two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal

Current Practice: Same

Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: Forty Days and Forty Nights, 829 Recessional hymn: When I Survey the Wondrous Cross, 838

Kyriale: Mass XVII, 762; Credo VI, 788

Chant after Offertory: *Parce, Domine*, Gregorian Chant Marian Antiphon: *Ave Regina Cælorum*, Solemn Chant

On Ash Wednesday, Joel 2:17 is sung in the second antiphon during the imposition of ashes. The translation is: *Spare, O Lord, spare thy people; and give not thine inheritance to perdition.*

The simple chant sung today after the Offertory Antiphon uses the same verse as a refrain which is sung in alternatum with verses from a Lenten hymn attributed to St. Ambrose. The first verse of the hymn says: Let us appease His wrath, Beg for mercy from our Judge; Cry to Him in supplication, Let us all prostrate and say.

A manuscript from the Tours sacramentary—which dates from the 9th Century—illustrates the long association of this verse of scripture with the season of Lent and penitential occasions.

ATTENTION YOUNG LADIES AGES 14-17—The Mater Dei Praesidium of the Legion of Mary hopes to form a junior praesidium here at St. Lawrence and would like to invite you to prayerfully consider joining! Sixteen- and seventeen-year-olds can be officers.

Being a member of a Junior Legion of Mary is a wonderful way to form and develop one's love and devotion to our Blessed Mother and to serve her and her Son Jesus by serving the Church. The meetings take place weekly for an hour and are fashioned exactly like the adult meetings. They are led by two adult members of the Legion of Mary (Janeann Kakalecz and Alice Mansell), and two junior members who would also be officers. The Legion follows the method of St. Louis Marie de Montfort's True Devotion to Mary, as established by its founder Frank Duff in Ireland on September 7, 1921, and which has spread throughout the entire world. The apostolic work of the junior praesidium is varied and carried out in a variety of settings—some at the parish, others outside under the adult supervision of members of the Legion of Mary, and some in your home within your family. All of the work is of important value to the universal Church and to your parish and takes an additional commitment of one to one and a half hours per week.

FROM YOUR PARISH LIBRARIAN—The library has a new kiosk for checking books in and out, located by the librarian's desk. The procedure remains the same - The screen should show the Check in/out page. If you want to check out a book, touch the "Checkout" box. Take your library card and put it under the front of the screen, where there is a scanner. Make sure the barcode is facing upwards! The screen will show you as signed in. Scan the book barcode in the same way you scanned your card. The screen will now show your name and the book title. Touch the "I'm Done" box. Next, you can choose to have an email receipt sent to you. To check books back in, touch "Check in" and scan the book or books and then touch "I'm Done." If the screen does not show the Check in/out page, touch the home button. If a login is asked for, touch "sign in with Google" and then choose "Library Kiosk," then "Continue."
