ANNOUNCEMENTS

SECOND COLLECTION—This week our second collection is for the building fund.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS—Please join us to pray the Stations of the Cross every Wednesday and Friday during Lent at 5:30pm before the regularly scheduled Masses. The evening schedule is as follows: Vespers (5pm), Stations and Confessions (5:30pm), Mass (6:30pm). The Stations conclude with a blessing with a relic of the true cross, which our parish is most blessed to have in our custody. Please also know that there is an indulgence available, under the normal conditions, for participating in this devotion.

MAR. 25: THE ANNUNCIATION—Join us on Tuesday at 6:30pm to assist at the High Mass in honor of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Matins hymn for this feast proclaims: "He, whom earth, and sea, and the firmament, worship, adore, and praise; he, the King of the triple kingdom, is carried in Mary's womb. The womb of a Virgin, who has been filled with heavenly grace, bears him, whom the moon, and sun, and all creatures serve in the order marked for them. O Mother, blessed in her great office! He, the sovereign Creator, who holds the world in the palm of his hand, is enclosed in the tabernacle of her womb. The angelic messenger proclaims her blessed; the holy Spirit makes her fruitful; and the Desired of nations is born of her." "This is a great day, not only to man, but even to God Himself; for it is the anniversary of the most solemn event that time has ever witnessed. On this day, the divine Word, by whom the Father created the world, was made flesh in the womb of a virgin, and dwelt among us" (Dom Gueranger, The Liturgical Year).

MAR. 29: PARISH FAITH BEE— The top ten scorers of 7th and 8th graders in the initial written test will move on to the oral competition on Saturday, Mar. 29, at 2:30pm in the Parish Center. The winner of the St. Lawrence Catholic Faith Bee will have the honor of representing our parish at the Diocesan Catholic Faith Bee that will be held on Wednesday, Apr. 9, at 1:30pm in the diocesan center in Harrisburg.

APR. 5: LENTEN MEDITATION—On Saturday, Apr. 5, St. Lawrence Church will host the Chamber Singers of Messiah University with orchestra for a Lenten meditation. Buxtehude's *Membra Jesu Nostri* comprises of seven cantatas, each of which addresses a part of Jesus' crucified body: feet, knees, hands, side, breast, heart, and face. In each cantata, its main text is drawn from Biblical passages and the medieval hymn Salve mundi salutare, formerly ascribed to St. Bernard of Clairvaux but now thought to be by Cistercian monk Arnulf of Leuven. Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: *Jesus, Meek And Lowly*, 833 Recessional hymn: *Forty Days and Forty Nights*, 829

Kyriale: Mass XVII, 762; Credo VI, 788

Offertory Antiphon: Justitiæ Domine, G.P. Palestrina

Part of **G.P. Palestrina's** prolific compositional output includes the publication, *Offertoria totius anni*, which contains 68 five-voice choral settings of Offertory Antiphons for Sundays and major feasts. This Sunday's Offertory is taken from this compilation.

Palestrina uses melodies and harmonies centered in a major key, giving the motet a bright color and conveying the joyful nature of the Psalm. The statutes of the Lord are right, and rejoice the heart his judgments sweeter also than honey, and the honeycomb. For thy servant keeps them. —Psalm 18:9,11-12

The melody of Attende Domine is a musical plainsong created in the early 19th century. It includes a short refrain – Hear us, O mighty Lord, show us your Mercy: Sinners we stand before you.— repeated between longer verses. Because of its great popularity, it was included in the books of Solesmes in the 20th century, The current text is adapted from the Preces of the office of Sext on the Wednesday of the fifth week of Lent in the Mozarabic rite. It can be traced back to the 10th century, on which the monks of Solesmes composed a new melody following a Mode V Gregorian melody. The setting sung by the choir is a version that retains the new melody and is harmonized by the Tenor and Bass voices.

G.P. Palestrina (c. 1525–1594) is highly regarded for his contributions of Sacred Polyphony and development of counterpoint in the late 16th Century. In the post-Tridentine period he earned the reputation of the ideal Catholic composer for his success in reconciling the functional and aesthetic aims of Catholic church music. Palestrina wrote over 105 Masses and 250 sacred motets in addition to many other works.


