SATURDAY PARKING—Regarding the parking crisis, the response so far to our requests for help from our state's elected officials has mostly been disappointing, though there have been a couple of exceptions. In general, they tend to repeat the same incorrect information, stating that the parking rates are a local issue controlled by the city. This is not the case. On our website, we provide many details proving this, including a link to the Department of Community and Economic Development's own website, which clearly states that one of it's agencies, Pennsylvania Economic Development Financing Authority (PEDFA), has the authority "to set parking rates for the parking system." We ask you to continue your efforts to explain this to your state senators and representatives. Feel free to give them the link to our web page that explains it in more detail: www. stlawrence.cc/parkingcrisis. Our request is simple: please temporarily restore the LUVHBG code for free Saturday parking until an economic impact study can be completed.

PENTECOST NOVENA—We will continue the singing of the *Veni Creator* with its proper collect after all Masses until Pentecost Sunday, June 8.

JUNE 8: PLENARY INDULGENCE—A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who devoutly assist at the recitation or solemn singing of the *Veni Creator Spiritus*, either on the first day of the year to implore divine assistance for the course of the whole year, or on the solemnity of Pentecost (Handbook of Indulgences Ch. 26, §1, 1°). *Veni Creator Spiritus* (Come, Creator Spirit) is a traditional hymn that is ascribed to Rabanus Maurus, a ninth-century German monk, teacher, and archbishop. This ancient hymn has been used in the liturgy since the eleventh century.

FATHER'S DAY NOVENA OF MASSES—Saturday, June 14, is the deadline to submit your intentions for the Father's Day Novena of Masses. Father's Day Novena Cards are available at the entrance of the church. You may place your cards in the collection baskets, or drop them off in the wall slots by the sacristy office or on the first floor of the 112 State Street parish center. Father's Day this year is on Sunday, June 15, which is when the Novena will begin.

Notes on Today's Music

Processional hymn: Hail The Day That Sees Him Rise, 852

Recessional hymn: Alleluia, Sing to Jesus, 936

Kyriale: Mass I, 696; Credo III, 776

Offertory Antiphon: Ascendit Deus, Christoph Dalitz (b.1967) Hymn after Offertory: *Triasagion*, Bortniansky (1751–1825) Communion Hymn: Jesu nostra redemptio, Tomás Luis de Victoria

Jesu nostra redemptio by Tomás Luis de Victoria is a setting of the an older form of the Vespers hymn during Ascensiontide. As with the other settings, the Gregorian melody is sung for the odd verses and the even are through composed. That melody is the cantus firmus where in verse two the Soprano voice sings the tune in a very elongated fashion which spans the entire choral verse, likewise the tenors do the same in the fourth verse. Those who sing the Divine Office regularly will recognize that the Gregorian melody is the same as the current Ascensiontide Vespers hymn, Salútis humánæ Sátor.

Tomás Luis de Victoria (c.1548–1611), along with Palestrina and de Lassus, is one of the greatest composers of the 16th C., famous for its ethereal polyphony. Ordained a priest at age 27, he lived in Rome for years, and assisted St. Philip Neri as chaplain of San Girolamo della Carità.
