**SECOND COLLECTION**—This week our second collection is for the education and care of priests of the diocese.

**FR. CORTES ON RETREAT**—Fr. Cortes is scheduled to be on his annual retreat from Monday, June 9, through Friday, June 13.

FIRST MASS AT ST. LAWRENCE—We are blessed to have Fr. Steven Kalinowski, FSSP, visiting today to celebrate the High Mass. He will offer first blessings after all Sunday Masses.

**TODAY: PLENARY INDULGENCE**—A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who devoutly assist at the recitation or solemn singing of the *Veni Creator Spiritus*, either on the first day of the year to implore divine assistance for the course of the whole year, or on the solemnity of Pentecost (*Handbook of Indulgences*, Ch. 26, §1, 1°). *Veni Creator Spiritus* ("Come, Creator Spirit") is a traditional hymn ascribed to Rabanus Maurus, a ninth-century German monk, teacher, and archbishop.

FATHER'S DAY NOVENA OF MASSES—Saturday, June 14, is the deadline to submit your intentions for the Father's Day Novena of Masses. Father's Day Novena Cards are available at the entrance of the church. You may place your cards in the collection baskets, or drop them off in the wall slots by the sacristy office or on the first floor of the 112 State Street parish center. Father's Day this year is on Sunday, June 15, which is when the Novena will begin.

CHANT CAMP REGISTRATION—Monday, July 7, to Friday, July 11. Registration for Chant Camp 2025 is now open for both parishioners and non-parishioners. Each day includes instruction on sacred music, praying the Divine Office, with a Sung Mass on Friday, July 11, the feast of St. Pius I, Pope & Martyr. THE CONFRATERNITY OF ST. PETER—The Confraternity of St. Peter is a group established to support the FSSP and its charism through prayers and sacrifices. Members pray a decade of the Rosary and a special Confraternity prayer every day, and also request one Mass per year be said for supporting vocations, the sanctification of priests, and their pastoral endeavors. WHIT SUNDAY, THE DAY OF PENTECOST—"The great day, which consummates the work that God had undertaken for the human race, has at last shone upon the world. The days of Pentecost, as St. Luke says, are accomplished. We have had seven weeks since the Pasch; and now comes the day that opens the mysterious number of fifty. This day is the Sunday, already made holy by the creation of the light, and by the Resurrection of Jesus: it is about to receive its final consecration, and bring us the fullness of God.

"In the old and figurative Law, God foreshadowed the glory that was to belong, at a future period, to the fiftieth day. Israel had passed the waters of the Red Sea, thanks to the protecting power of his Paschal Lamb! Seven weeks were spent in the desert, which was to lead to the promised land; and the very morrow of those seven weeks was the day whereon was made the alliance between God and His people. The Pentecost (the fiftieth day) was honoured by the promulgation of the ten commandments of the divine law; and every following year, the Israelites celebrated the great event by a solemn festival. But their Pentecost was figurative, like their Pasch: there was to be a second Pentecost for all people, as there was to be a second Pasch, for the Redemption of the whole world. The Pasch, with all its triumphant joys, belongs to the Son of God, the Conqueror of death: Pentecost belongs to the Holy Ghost, for it is the day whereon He began His mission into this world, which, henceforward, was to be under His Law.

"But how different are the two Pentecosts! The one, on the rugged rocks of Arabia, amidst thunder and lightning, promulgates a Law that is written on tablets of stone; the second is in Jerusalem, on which God's anger has not as yet been manifested, because it still contains within its walls the first fruits of that new people, over whom the Spirit of love is to reign. In this second Pentecost, the heavens are not overcast, nor is the roar of thunder heard; the hearts of men are not stricken with fear, as when God spake on Sinai; repentance and gratitude are the sentiments now uppermost. A divine fire burns within their souls, and will spread throughout the whole world. Our Lord Jesus had said: 'I am come to cast fire on the earth; and what will I, but that it be kindled?' The hour for the fulfilment of this word has come: the Spirit of love, the Holy Ghost, the eternal uncreated Flame, is about to descend from heaven, and realize the merciful design of our Redeemer." #### **Notes on Today's Music**

Hymn prior to Mass: Veni Creator Spiritus, 956 Recessional hymn: Come Down, O Love Divine, 887

Kyriale: I, 696; Credo: III, 776

Marian antiphon: Regina Cæli, Solemn Chant

Communion antiphon: Factus Est Repente, Jacobus Gallus

The communion antiphon takes its text from Acts 2: "Suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a mighty wind coming where they were sitting, alleluia; and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit, speaking the wonderful works of God, alleluia, alleluia." Jacobus Gallus uses wide intervals in each voice to make the sound from heaven followed by pairs of voices creating the mighty wind. The whole motet ends with rhythmic two fold repeat of Alleluias.

Jacobus Gallus (1550-1591), was a late-Renaissance composer of presumed Slovene ethnicity. Born in Carniola, which at the time was one of the Habsburg lands in the Holy Roman Empire, he lived and worked in Moravia and Bohemia during the last decade of his life. His output was both sacred and secular, and hugely prolific: over 500 works have been attributed to him.
