STATE STREET ACADEMY DEPARTURE—When the old parish of St. Lawrence was merged with the Cathedral in the 1990s, a group of Protestants, Jews, and Catholics joined forces to save St. Lawrence Church. The group all agreed that it would be a great shame for this gloriously beautiful church to come to ruin so they raised hundreds of thousands of dollars to inject into the church, in the process converting the dirt-floor basement into a finished music study which has been used since then by the State Street Academy of Music. We owe those people, and the Academy a debt of gratitude for saving our church. I ask you to keep each of them in your prayers. Since we purchased this church in 2022, the Academy has recognized that the space is best suited for worship, and that the original goal of saving the church had been achieved. The Academy is now moving to St. Paul Episcopal Church in Harrisburg, which means they will not need to use the church for performances any more (indeed, they stopped this of their own accord once we purchased the church), nor the basement for their studios. The basement space will be very valuable for us as classrooms, a new cry room, and for socials (outside of Mass times), but we will also lose the income provided by the Academy, which was approximately \$25,000 per year.

Notes on Today's Music Processional hymn: <i>Come, Holy Ghost, Creator Blest</i>, 833 Recessional hymn: <i>Holy God, We Praise Thy Name</i>, 881 Kyriale: Mass III, 705; Credo II, 772 Motet after Offertory: <i>Tu Es Petrus</i>, Rev. Michael Haller (1840–1915) Communion Antiphon: <i>Tu Es Petrus</i>, Heinrich Isaac Both choral works for this Sunday use the text <i>Tu Es Petrus</i>, which is the communion antiphon for the Feast of Ss. Peter & Paul. Rev. Michael Haller sets the text in a simple four part hymn style. While the setting by Heinrich Isaac takes its inspiration from the original Gregorian melody. Isaac begins with the incipit from the chant and each voice enters individually; the bass voice has keeps the melody throughout. Isaac illustrates building—“...<i>I will build my church</i>.”—by having each voice stack on top of one another and form the only static chord in the middle of this short motet. Heinrich Isaac (c.1450–1517) was a Renaissance composer from the South Netherlandish region. His output was rivaled only by Orlandus Lassus in number and variety of composition. Most notable of his collections is <i>Choralis Constantinus</i> which contains nearly 400 Gregorian chant based motets of propers for the Mass.
